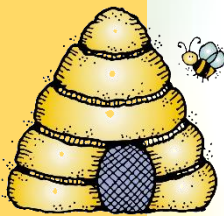

Education Activity

Learn about honeybees, their habitat and habits. Learn what to plant in your gardens to attract honeybees and other pollinators. Local honey will also be available to taste.



Art Activities

Bee Hive - help paint a functional bee hive that will be home for a colony of honeybees at the Curtis Center for the Arts. Learn about all of its components and what the bees do inside.

Metal Stamping – use hammers and stamps to decorate a honeycomb shaped piece of copper or silver with bee, butterfly and flower images that can be worn as a charm on a necklace or bracelet.

Beeswax Lotion Bars – learn how to make your own naturally scented lotion bar using beeswax, base oils, and essential oils. Recipes will be provided.
